32	a. Approve a New Project for Groundwater Well Tabulation and Monitoring, as well as the
33	Allocation and Budgeting of Costs
34	First in the collection of well data through a common found and builded from Hanson Allen and Luce the

36	might be \$20,000 for the project. They would like to collect well data put it in format that could be

Chris Hansen replied they have followed the districts. Junior Baker stated we can follow any of our member's policies. Warren Peterson said we need to have a scope of work before we can move forward, he doesn't feel like they should act on these items today.

Howard Chuntz **moved** to authorize the technical committee to move forward to get information to allow the board to make a decision on a firm to represent item b and item c for the board to review at the next meeting. Richard Nielsen **seconded** and the motion passed with all in favor.

c. Approve the Hiring of Legal Counsel for Mt. Nebo Activities, with Emphasis on a Groundwater Plan and Monitoring of Groundwater Applications

Water Banking

Steve Clyde stated there is a bill drafted that will go to the legislature in January. The goal is to deal with the reality of the decline of water supply while the population continues to grow.

Agricultural Water Task Force

Warren Peterson stated the Agricultural Water Optimization Task Force is making a lot of progress. They will have funding available to sponsor research. He also reported that a bill to allow creation of watershed councils by local water users is close to being completed and would likely be introduced in the General Session. Steve Clyde also commented on the bill.

Set Dates for 2020 Meetings

Junior Baker stated the agency meets 5 times per year. They usually meet on the third Monday of February, May, June, August and November. They have moved the meeting in February because of President's Day so it will be held the fourth Monday. He asked if they felt like they needed to meet more often. Marty Larsen commented they could add more meetings if they needed to. Junior Baker said they

could call a special meeting. Howard Chuntz asked if they could move the May meeting to May 11 or May 26th. The board decided to meet on Tuesday May 26th.

Marty Larsen **moved** to adopt the dates of February 24, May 26, June 15, August 17, and November 16, 2020. Warren Peterson **seconded** the motion **passed** with all in favor.

Other Business

a. Treasurers Bond

 Junior Baker stated a treasure's bond is required to handle finances for the agency. We require two board member signatures on checks. Board members have no access to the checks, so that creates separation. The state is requiring the agency have the bond and we need to discuss that contract. Junior commented the estimated fee is \$150. Junior stated he is retiring in April and Dave Tuckett from Payson City will be taking his place. He advised to bond Dave instead of him. Chairman Gene Shawcroft asked for thoughts from the board. They were in support.

Richard Nielson **moved** to authorize the treasurers bond for Dave Tuckett to handle finances for the agency. Brett Christensen **seconded** and the motion **passed** with all in favor.
